

CHUKKI BA- JOURNALISM

Dr. Seetha R, Head of the Tamil Department at St. Philomena's College, has been conferred the prestigious National Excellence Award by the Xavier Board of Higher Education for her exceptional research contributions. Her academic achievements are impressive:

Notably, she has translaed the esteemed Tamil grammar book "Nannul" into Kannada. Dr. Seetha R. has published over 150 papers in international and national seminars, receiving numerous awards from private organizations. She has presented papers globally, including in Malaysia, Singapore, Geneva, and Abu Dhabi. Her poems and literary talks are available on YouTube, courtesy of outlets like Germany Air Station, the UK, the Netherlands, and Surya TV."



Ma'am, could you share some insights about your childhood?

I experienced significant transformations during my college days. As a student, I had a passion for writing poetry. During my time at All India Radio, I was interviewed by officials and responded fearlessly, showcasing my knowledge. I didn't feel any fear at that time. Many people recognized my talent for writing poetry and suggested I pursue an M.A. in Tamil, which I did. I also completed a diploma in journalism and had the opportunity to interview Governor Sadik Ali.

What inspired you to pursue your accomplishments, and who has been your role model?

As a young girl, I idolized doctors and felt a sense of fulfillment just by seeing them. I would daydream about becoming a doctor and wearing a white coat - a dream that still resonates with me today. One doctor, Dr. Ponnamma, stood out to me as an exemplary model of kindness and humility. Even now, I feel a deep sense of admiration and respect whenever I see a doctor.
